TRACK HISTORY

July 1, 1953: Vernon Downs opens its doors for the first time to a crowd of 4,632 racegoers. Bob Abbe II wins the first race over the Central New York racecourse, covering 6-1/2 furlongs in 1:44.1. A total of \$114,777 is wagered on the first of 67 programs contested through the inaugural season.

1955: The three-quarter mile track is dubbed "The Home of the Miracle Mile" after Adios Harry paced one mile in 1:55, a world race record which held up for 15 years.

1964: Legendary racecaller Jim Moran debuts at Vernon, sharing duties with announcer Bud Hebert before embarking on a half-century career as the voice of harness racing in central New York.

1965: Bret Hanover attracts a crowd of 14,169 to the Miracle Mile for the season's featured three-year-old pacing event.

1966: Bret Hanover again makes Vernon Downs history, establishing a 1:54 world record in a time trial. The grandstand is enclosed with large sliding windows, affording racegoers protection from inclement conditions while still allowing for open-air atmosphere on warm summer nights.

1971: The downstairs clubhouse restaurant is now air conditioned, and the track is rated the second fastest in America by the United States Trotting Association.

1972: The upper-level clubhouse restaurant is renamed the Gold Cup Room from the Mohawk Terrace, while the downstairs section becomes the Miracle Mile Room after two decades as the Turfside Terrace.

1973: AmTote installs a computerized pari-mutuel system, and 61 television monitors are installed throughout the facility.

1974: Instant replay of races is offered for the first time.

1980: Niatross, who was based at Vernon in a 13-for-13 freshman season, returns to Vernon with driver Clint Galbraith after their Meadowlands Pace triumph to capture the Gaines Stakes in 1:53.3, a new track record. A new lighting system is installed around the track.

1984: Sunday racing is welcomed to Vernon Downs.

1985: Prakas sets the trotting record at Vernon with a 1:56 mile in the Founders Gold Cup for three-year-olds.

1988: Call For Rain establishes a new speed mark at Vernon with a 1:52.3 mile on August 20. Ver non Downs Hi

1989: Dexter Nukes equals Call For Rain's mark of 1:52.3 in the Gaines Stakes.

1991: The inside hub rail is removed and replaced with pegs marking the inside of the track. May concert series begins.

1992: Stylish Cam takes another second off the track record with a 1:51.3 performance in the North American Pacing Series.

1994: Canaco On Time turns in a 1:51.1 mile on the pace. The Vernon Downs Hotel, located at the top of the present-day homestretch, opens in November as the Vernon Comfort Suites.

1995: Deliberate Speed's 1:55 Founders Stakes win establishes a new trotting track record.

1996: Oye Vay's 1:50.3 Gaines Stakes victory is the fastest mile in four decades of racing at Vernon. Both three-year-old trotting divisions of the Breeders Crown are held at Vernon, with Personal Banner (1:54.1) and Running Sea (1:55) winning the filly and colt divisions, respectively.

2000: After 47 years of the unique six-furlong track configuration replete with a chute for starting one-mile races in the homestretch, a new 7/8-mile oval is unveiled on July 1.

2004: Vernon Downs closes its doors in July.

TRACK HISTORY

2006: New York real-estate mogul and harness racing enthusiast Jeff Gural purchases Vernon Downs out of bankruptcy. Bob's Ring Of Fire and Chuck Connor Jr. win the first race of the abbreviated 30-day meet. Easton Alliance N and Cat Manzi won the \$83,500 Artiscape for distaff pacers in 1:51.

2007: The Credit Winner free-for-all trot debuts at Vernon Downs. Vivid Photo and Roger Hammer take the lion's share of the \$154,000 purse with a 1:52.1 victory in the first of ten renewals of the event, which later would be named the Crawford Farms Trot and would move to sister track Tioga Downs in 2017.

2013: Intimidate and Ron Pierce establish the all-age trotting record at Vernon with a 1:51 win in the Credit Winner.

2014: After 50 years behind the microphone, Jim Moran calls his final race at Vernon Downs.

2015: Speedy local mainstays Fireyourguns and JK Panache both record 1:47.3 miles at Vernon to jointly hold the all-age track pacing record.

2018: The one and only Atlanta 3 year old trotting queen out of Chapter Seven sets a new track record in her EBC finals score here at Vernon of 1:50.3 on May 28th 2018.

2021: Cattlewash out of the Ron Burke barn goes wire to wire in a short field of 5 to break the track record for 4 year old pacers in a time of 1:49.0 flat.

Zweig

Top 3-year-old trotters are featured annually at Vernon Downs in the Harold M. Zweig Memorial, which features separate open and filly divisions.

Ambassador Hanover (Ake Svanstedt) charged right to the front. The big favorite **Dancinginthedark**M went on a break at the start of the race. **Ambassador Hanover** went to the quarter first in :27.0. **Balenciaga**(Scott Zeron) made a first over-move and challenged down the backstretch. Ambassador Hanover had a short lead to the half in :56.3. Balenciaga battled Ambassador Hanover all the way around the final turn. Balenciaga took control and led to three-quarters in 1:24.1.

As they made the turn for home **Spy Booth** (\$21,60) came flying down the stretch and took over the lead and braced for a late move by Take All Comers (David Miller). Spy Booth held on to win his first career race in 1:52.3. It was the first time the Zweig was won by a maiden. **Take All Comers** was second but placed fifth for interference in the stretch. Balenciaga was awarded second with **Zenith Stride** (Andrew McCarthy) getting third money. Spy Booth is a 3-year-old gelding by Muscle Hill. He is trained by Nancy Takter for owners John Fielding, David Anderson, Robert LeBlanc, and Marvin Katz. It was his first career victory.

Contested Hanover (Tim Tetrick), Splash Blue Chip (Ake Svanstedt), and Iteration (Brian Sears) all left for the lead and were three across the track as they headed for the first turn.

Iteration wrestled the lead away and led to the first quarter in :27.1. **Iteration** used a :30.3 second quarter to hit the half in :57.4. **Darlene Hanover** made her move first-over going around the far turn.

Iteration still led to three-quarters in 1:26.4.

As they reached the stretch Darlene Hanover blew right on by and breezed home to win easily in 1:53.4.

Aunt Irene (Dexter Dunn) came closing late to finish second. Contested Hanover was third.

Darlene Hanover is a filly by Chapter Seven. She is owned by Yankeeland partners and trained by Brett Bittle. It was her third win of the season and seventh career victory.

2021 Empire Breeders Classic Recap By John Horne for Vernon Downs



Vernon Downs played host to the **Empire Breeders Classic (EBC)** for sophomore trotting colts and geldings as well as two divisions for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Friday (June 18). **Andrew McCarthy** wins two of the three races. McCarthy piloted Ahundreddollarbill (\$3.60) to an impressive victory in the \$205,500 EBC for trotting colts and geldings.

Ambassador Hanover (Ake Svanstedt) left from his outside post to grab the early lead. His stablemate Incommunicado (Yannick Gingras) took over the lead just before hitting the first quarter in :27.0. Incommunicado used a :29.4 second quarter to hit the half in :56.4. Ahundreddollarbill made his move first-up from third going around the final turn. Incommunicado held a narrow lead as he hit three-quarters first in 1:26.0.

As they made the turn for home Ahundreddollarbill turned on the after burners as they went down the stretch. Incommunicado just couldn't keep up. As they reached mid-stretch it was all Ahundreddollarbill as he won easily in 1:53.2. Ambassador Hanover came up to finish second best. Incommunicado had to settle for third.

Ahundreddollarbill is a 3-year-old gelding by Chapter Seven. He is trained by Tony Alagna for owners

Crawford Farms Racing and James Crawford IV. The gelding if three for three in 2021. He now has five career wins.

Iteration (Brian Sears) is supreme in the \$102,500 first division of the EBC for trotting fillies.

Contested Hanover (Scott Zeron) took the lead and led to the first quarter in :27.0. Iteration (\$2.80) made her move popping out of the pocket and getting the lead at the top of the back stretch. She was first to the half in :56.4. She continued to control things by leading to three-quarters in 1:25.0. As they reached the stretch Contested Hanover and Moni For Lindy (Wally Hennessey) both went all out on the chase but Iteration had plenty in the tank and won in a lifetime best of 1:53.1. Contested Hanover ran a great race to finish second. Moni For Lindy got third money.

Iteration is a 3-year-old filly by Chapter Seven. The filly is owned by Courant Inc. and trained by Marcus Melander. She is two for two as a sophomore. She now owns seven career victories. She wins the EBC just like her brother Gimpanzee did a couple years ago at Vernon.

Darlene Hanover (McCarthy) holds off late charge by Sweeping Rainbow (David Miller) to capture the \$102,500 second division of the EBC for trotting fillies.

Soukup Blue Chip (Andy Miller) jumped out to the early late. Sweeping Rainbow took command and hit the first quarter first in :28.2. Darlene Hanover (\$4.40) made her move down the backstretch going first-over from third and zoomed by to lead to the half in :58.2. She was first to three-quarters in 1:27.2.

As they reached the stretch Sweeping Rainbow popped out of the pocket and the race was on. **Sweeping Rainbow** came charging as **Darlene Hanover** dug down deep and just held on to win in 1:54.3. Sweeping Rainbow settled for second best. Soukup Blue Chip finished third.

Darlene Hanover is a 3-year-old filly by Chapter Seven. She is owned by Yankeeland Partners and trained by Brett Bittle. It was her first win in 2021. She now has five career victories




